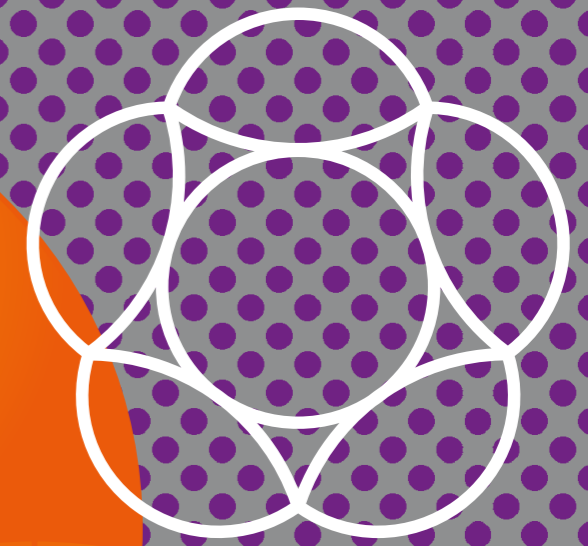

What is Centre of the Cell?

Centre of the Cell is a science education centre based at the Whitechapel Campus of Queen Mary, University of London. It is the first science education centre in the world to be located within working biomedical research laboratories.

Centre of the Cell is located inside our distinctive orange 'Pod' suspended above biomedical research laboratories, so visitors will be able to see research scientists at work as they enter the centre. Once inside, visitors will learn about the amazing world of cells, the human body and the latest medical research.

Since the project opened to the public in September 2009, there have been over 80,000 participants in Centre of the Cell activities. We have won a number of major awards including the Museums & Heritage Excellence Award for the Best Educational Initiative in the UK and the EngageU Award for the Best Innovations in University Outreach and Public Engagement in Europe.



Outcomes

Centre of the Cell is dedicated to inspiring curiosity and learning by connecting science to everyday life. We seek to have a positive influence on the career, educational and personal health choices of children and young people.

We aim to:

- Inspire the next generation of scientists and healthcare professionals
- Stimulate interest, excitement and dialogue about biomedical research
- Raise aspirations, especially in our local community
- Promote learning within the family and community
- Improve lives of young people from disadvantaged backgrounds
- Widen participation in further and higher education
- Improve health and wellbeing in our local communities
- Create a local, national and global centre of excellence in Public Engagement

What do we offer?

- Interactive sessions for schools in the 'Pod' during term time for pupils in Year 5 to Year 13
- Interactive sessions for families in the 'Pod' during the school holidays
- An online destination featuring more than 150 pages of unique content, videos, teachers' resources and interactive games (www.centrefofthecell.org)
- Fun-filled science shows and workshops that can be delivered in schools and community organisations, as well as in Whitechapel
- Special events such as the 'Big Question' lecture series
- A Youth Membership Scheme for 14–19 year olds that includes internships, volunteering opportunities, mentoring and revision sessions, careers advice, and the Centre of the Cell Youth Panel

'Pod' sessions

Our distinctive orange 'Pod' is suspended above the laboratories in the Blizard Institute in Barts and The London School of Medicine and Dentistry, so visitors will be able to see research scientists at work as they enter the centre. Once inside, the experience includes KS2–KS5 curriculum-linked interactive games grounded in cell biology and the research happening in the labs below and around the world.

As well as our trained Explainers, we aim to have at least one medical or dental student and / or scientist join each visiting group to enhance the learning experience and to answer visitors' questions about science and careers.

'Pod' sessions are suitable for visitors aged 7 and up. A school session costs £150 and can accommodate up to 40 visitors (including accompanying adults), although we recommend 30 visitors for an optimal experience. For our family visits, individual tickets can be purchased in advance.

We offer fun-filled and curriculum-linked science shows and workshops that can be delivered at schools and community organisations.

Students take part in activities that connect science to everyday life and enhance what they have been learning in class.
